Progress/Records

Each student's progress in school shall be observed, evaluated, recorded, and reported to parents/guardians. In a format approved by the Superintendent of Schools, regular, formal reports shall be made to parents/guardians on each student's progress. The progress report should reflect the educational growth of the student in relationship to the student's ability, attitudes, interests, conduct or citizenship, and achievement.

Parent Conferences

Conferences with parents are to be considered an integral part of the school system's method for reporting student progress to parents. Teachers shall schedule conferences with parents in accordance with the schedule set by the school administration and whenever it is deemed advisable by the teacher or requested by the parent. Conferences shall be scheduled at a mutually convenient time and at such time that the teacher does not have a class responsibility.
