

The Philosophy Behind the Retake/Revise Policy



The Purpose of Public School

Intellectual development, career readiness, social awareness, civic responsibility



The retake/revise policy is aimed at advancing the goal of intellectual development.



Intellectual Development: Acquiring and developing the knowledge and skills deemed important by society (Waterford Board of Education).



How does the retake/revise policy advance intellectual development?

- The policy encourages students to keep trying when they are not successful the first time around
- The policy gives students an opportunity to build up skills
 & knowledge where they have deficits
- The policy works to reduce the negative snowball effect of academic failure

The CLMS Retake/Revise Policy Prevents the Snowball Effect of Academic Failure

THE SNOWBALL FFFF of academic

fails to acquire math skill in 6th grade

> fails to acquire multiple skills in 7th grade math because those new skills build upon the skill student failed to acquire in grade 6

fails to acquire even more skills in 8th grade math because these new skills are built upon grade 7 skills





But Mr. Higgins, doesn't this retake/redo/revise policy just send students the message that failure doesn't have consequences? How does this policy prepare our students for the harsh consequences they will face in the real world?



This is a valid concern shared by quite a few teachers at CLMS

- Failure does have consequences (record keeping in PowerSchool, team montoring of retakes, parent contact & STAT referrals)
- Habits of the Mind coming to the CLMS Report Card
- Real world is filled with second chances on tests (driver's license, SAT, BAR exam for lawyers, etc...)

The Mechanics of the Retake/Revise Policy



CLMS Retake Policy 2019-2020

We believe in a growth mindset and value that the learning process varies for each student. While students are expected to put forth their best effort on all assignments, some students may require additional time and instruction to master content. To this end, Clark Lane teachers encourage students to try again when they do not achieve mastery.

Retake Guidelines

- Students will be given the opportunity to retake all major assessments they have not mastered (scores less than 75% or below proficiency on rubric). These include summative assessments such as unit tests and tasks directly related to the standards presented in the curriculum. Other graded assignments may be retaken at teacher discretion.
- When students retake assessments, the higher score will be used to calculate the final grade. The original score will be noted in the comment section in PowerSchool.
- A minimum of one retake per major assessment will be offered; additional retakes will be offered at teacher discretion.
- Teacher will indicate to students if an assignment is eligible for retake and will note if student took advantage of the opportunity.
- Teacher may decide to modify the format of the assessment for a retake based on individual student needs.

Retake Protocol

- The student must make a request for a retake within five school days from the date the assessment is returned. Per teacher discretion, this timeframe may be extended.
- The retake does not need to take place within five days of the grade being shared.
- The student will be given a sufficient amount of time to relearn the content prior to a retake.
- The student and teacher will both agree to a learning remediation plan prior to a retake. This plan will include an understanding of why the student did not reach mastery and an outline of steps to improve chances of success. Teachers may use the CLMS Learning Remediation Plan.
- Parents will be notified if a pattern of refused retakes is observed, and the student may also be referred to the STAT team.

Students will be given the opportunity to retake all major assessments they have not mastered (scores less than 75% or below proficiency on rubric). These include summative assessments such as unit tests and tasks directly related to the standards presented in the curriculum. Other graded assignments may be retaken at teacher discretion.

Academic grade should reflect academic ability

When students retake assessments, the higher score will be used to calculate the final grade. The original score will be noted in the comment section in PowerSchool.


minimum of one retake per major assessment will be offered; additional retakes will be offered at teacher discretion.

Teacher will indicate to students if an assignment is eligible for retake and will note if student took advantage of the opportunity.

Step 1. Log onto Powerschool




Step 3. Search for any assignments that have the blue "talk box" symbol



Retake Protocol

- retake does not need to take place within five days (reasonable amount of time)
- student and teacher will agree to a plan for remediation
- · parents will be notified if a pattern of refusal or failure develops
