



- <u>SAT:</u> College placement exam (April—11th grade)


Support systems

- 84% students earned a 3 or higher on Advanced Placement (AP) exams
- WHS students earned credit for 102 college courses through dual enrollment (breakdown below):

- 34 courses earned through 2-year college dual enrollment program (CCP)
- One course earned through Connecticut College's New London Scholars Program


